	Mr Jim Murdoch provided IJB members with an overview of engagement activities undertaken in line with the Participation and Engagement Strategy 2023-26 and associated action plan.
	Members agreed to support the formation of an implementation group to deliver the strategy and associated action plan.
	Enquiry was made as to the appropriateness of patients having to disclose personal and confidential medical problems to receptionists at GP Surgeries. It was highlighted of the training that reception staff receive, and the initial triage function they are undertaking.

	The report highlighted anticipated delivery of approved Financial Recovery Plan savings in the current year, as well as additional cash releasing efficiency savings approved as part of the budget for 2024/25, and confirmation of funds within the IJB Reserve following approval of 2023/24 audited Annual Accounts on 25 September 2024.

	The report also provided a summary of the projected outturn position on services managed under Lead Partnership / Hosted Services arrangements, as well as information on Acute Services budgets in relation to the large hospitals Set Aside resource within the scope of the Strategic Plan, and highlighted underlying risk factors, which have the potential to impact on the projected outturn position for 2024/25 and going forward.	
	The Board noted the following recommendations:

11.	Vision for the Future of EACH Ms Marie Furniss presented the report to seek the agreement of the IJB to progress East Ayrshire Community Hospital (EACH) Model of Care work. It was noted that priority is given to delivering services and activities that aim to improve the overall health and wellbeing of the people of Cumnock and surrounding area and to agree to achieving this by enhancing existing in- patient and out-patient services and working with Health and Social Care, Third and Voluntary Sector partners, Cumnock Community and other organisations.	

	It was noted that there is real opportunity for EACH, especially in regards to dementia care, being a true example of joint working and using this collaboration to provide the best possible service.
	It was advised that work is ongoing as to how East Ayrshire shapes dementia care research going forward and that conversations have already taken place with colleagues from the University of Worcester around this. External funding to support further collaborative work around dementia is being actively pursued. It was noted that the Council had agreed to provide funding for the next 4 years (£150,000/per year) to undertake innovative work to increase the number of Power of Attorneys in place for high risk individuals in the year following a dementia diagnosis.
